



At the end of yet another difficult year for our neighbours across Toronto, I am so thankful for your partnership.

Galatians 6:9 (NIV) comes to mind as I think of you and your gracious support. "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

You—you're the reason we were able to respond and adapt to the ongoing hunger crisis made so much worse by rising food costs, inflation, and the high cost of living. You're the reason 216 men received shelter in 2022, and because of you, we were able to expand shelter operations to 24/7 so we can do more in the days ahead. But it was an amazing year for other important reasons, too . . .

This past year was the first full year Scott Mission offered new counselling and case management programs to provide the tools and encouragement needed to truly transform lives. I am thrilled to share that we are already beginning to see the impact of this outreach!

Scott Mission can continue to do good because *you* choose to do good. And we will never give up because Christ never gives up on us.

True life transformation is evident within the pages of this 2022 Annual Report. It is a testimony to how you directly enriched the lives of our youth and teens, helped bridge the hunger gap for families and individuals, and nurtured hope through counselling, support groups, ministry outreach, and life skills workshops. But it also looks forward as you'll see on pages 10 and 11, where we share our vision for taking help, hope, and food into the neighbourhoods where suffering is high.

YOU are sharing meals and food with neighbours facing hunger!

A hunger crisis has been growing since the pandemic first stormed into the GTA, and it continues to claim new victims as the cost of housing, groceries, fuel, and everything else climbs. For families like Ang's* who struggle to put food on the table, Scott Mission's food banks are making all the difference!

A job loss turned Ang's life upside down. Suddenly, everyday basics—like groceries for his family—became luxury items. But Ang found hope and access to healthy foods at Scott Mission! Between the fresh fruit, vegetables, and shelf-stable items, his loved ones are getting the nutritious meals they need.

With your ongoing support, Scott Mission will continue providing meals and groceries to our neighbours experiencing hunger. Thank you for your compassion for others! In 2022, Scott Mission provided 49% more hot meals than in 2021. We saw an increase of 14% in orders for groceries, and clothing appointments were numbered at 20,585—nearly double the number compared to 2021. And a shocking 43% of our neighbours in need chose to miss meals in order to pay for their basic living expenses.* In 2022—

YOU give help and hope to neighbours facing homelessness.

David is living proof that your gifts and prayers can make a life-transforming difference.

First, he lost his girlfriend, then a dear friend to cancer, next his apartment. At 69, overwhelmed and facing homelessness, suicide seemed the only solution. But because of generous friends like you, David found the help he needed at Scott Mission and is on a path to wellness.

For decades, Scott Mission has offered shelter to men who might otherwise sleep on our city streets. In March of 2022, our shelter relocated to 346 Spadina, and services were expanded to 24/7. The new location makes it possible for clients to stay in the building all day where they can access meals, laundry, showers, and a wide range of life-changing programs that include counselling, case management, mental health workshops, art programs, spiritual support, and more. All of this provides greater stability to our most vulnerable populations and more opportunities for life transformation.

In 2022, your support helped provide 16,682 nights of shelter—*THANK YOU!*

YOU bring health and healing to those most in need!

Your compassion and generosity helped establish clinical counselling and case management among Scott Mission's many vital services. Specialized care by trained staff and professionals promotes health and healing so clients can move past urgent needs to build a firm foundation for a healthy life and achieve true transformation.

In 2022, 26 clients participated in our **Clinical Counselling** program for mental health issues, ranging from anxiety and depression to abuse recovery. The program will offer expanded outreach in 2023 to include addiction and recovery counselling. Participants are thankful to receive the help they need to navigate a challenging time in life.

Scott Mission's **Case Management** program, which launched in October 2021, has served 50 clients, including shelter residents and former residents. Our rapid-advocacy model first addresses urgent issues so we can then address the spiritual, physical, psychological, and social needs of program participants. Each person's needs and circumstances are unique, so their case management can range from advocacy to intensive care. Positive outcomes demonstrate the effectiveness of case management in nurturing greater stability and health among participants.

YOU are enriching our communities with hope and long-term solutions!

For decades, Scott Mission has offered urgent needs services—food, shelter, and more—to neighbours in need across the GTA. Since COVID health measures have relaxed, last year marked a much anticipated return of our outreaches to support and strengthen our communities and the families and individuals who live there.

The Hub Will Serve More Under-Resourced Communities

Together we are expanding Scott Mission's reach to efficiently and effectively respond to the growing need across the GTA. Many of our neighbours are finding help through Scott Mission's 502 Spadina Avenue and O'Connor Family Centre locations. But other families and individuals travel great distances to access our critical services. We believe hours of travel to get the food someone needs to feed their family should not be another obstacle they have to overcome in their lives.

With the upcoming launch of Scott Mission's new Hub and Spoke model, we can better meet needs within under-resourced communities and achieve innovative strategies to address hunger and homelessness, transforming the lives of countless neighbours. Partnerships with local churches and our existing locations across the city (spokes) served by one central distribution centre (the hub) will allow for this efficient expansion of services.

Scott Mission has purchased a new location to serve as our centralized hub of administration, operations, and storage. This building will allow us to deliver meals, groceries, family services, counselling, and more directly into neighbourhoods, laying the foundation for a better future for generations to come. This facility will increase Scott Mission's life-transforming outreach to vulnerable populations by:

- Reducing lengthy travel times so neighbours in need can access critical services closer to home, allowing them more time for family, work, and other important activites.
- Allowing us to build on our work with community-based partners to provide better support for more people.

Together we are implementing creative ways to address hunger and homelessness, while overcoming unnecessarily long travel times for basic resources. Thank you for supporting these important strategies that will transform the lives of our neighbours who are in great need within their communities across the GTA.
